### Winter Exhibition Programme at Two Temple Place

---

*Sussex Modernism: Retreat and Rebellion* is the sixth Winter Exhibition at Two Temple Place and in 2016 the trust were delighted to receive support from the Arts Council England that has secured the programme until 2021. Plans for the 2018 exhibition in partnership with The Arts Society on the Age of Jazz and a celebration of the bicentenary of John Ruskin in 2019 with the Guild of St George and Sheffield Museum are already well underway. In 2017 the Trust will appoint a formal Winter Exhibition Advisory Board, chaired by Martin Caiger-Smith, that will oversee all future programming. Martin runs the MA in Curating the Art Museum at the Courtauld Institute of Art and has been the main advisor to the programme since its inception in 2010.

A grant in 2015 has helped secure the future of AAK by funding the 'In Our Hands' nail bar programme which develops female role models in an area rife with gang crime and provides participants with formal qualifications.

Recycling Unlimited in Hull promotes positive mental health through mentoring and voluntary work. To date over 1400 isolated individuals have been trained to recycle used timber into saleable garden furniture. Funding in 2015 has enabled RU to go beyond mental health and set up a community farm for local people to come together to grow their own produce.

### Developing Small Charities

---

The Bulldog Trust's venture-capital-style support for promising small charities and social enterprises will see a major expansion of activities in 2017. Current plans include the distribution of up to £10m in funding and pro bono business expertise worth £1.3m. Three new members of staff have been recruited in preparation and the advisory board for the project is chaired by Rupert Harrison CBE, who served as Chief of Staff to UK Chancellor of the Exchequer 2010-2015.

In the last twelve months the Trust has built a broad range of support for its plans including securing pro bono support for all branding and marketing, over £1m to cover operating costs and is currently in talks with a major institutional funding partner.
