Two Temple Place are delighted to once again offer our hugely successful **FREE** storytelling workshops for primary schools coinciding with our eighth exhibition, **John Ruskin: The Power of Seeing** (26<sup>th</sup> January – 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2019). The workshops will be led by experienced education providers, *theWholeStory*, who have led workshops at Historic Royal Palaces, the National Maritime Museum, the Horniman Museum, the Geffrye Museum and the Victoria & Albert Museum.

Two Temple Place, itself an extraordinary architectural gem built in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century along the Thames Embankment, will re-open on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2019 with the exhibition, **John Ruskin: The Power of Seeing**. For this exhibition Two Temple Place will bring together paintings, drawings, plaster casts, manuscripts and minerals to illustrate how Ruskin's attitude to beauty shaped his radical views on culture and society.

Our seven previous exhibitions, some of which include 'William Morris: Story, Memory, Myth' 2011-2012, 'DISCOVERIES: Art, Science & Exploration from the University of Cambridge Museums' 2014, 'Beyond Beauty: Transforming the body in ancient Egypt' 2016 and 'Rhythm & Reaction: The Age of Jazz in Britain' 2018 have attracted enormous interest, with over 280,000 members of the public visiting and over 5,000 London primary school children enjoying imaginative storytelling-led workshops. ## Who can make a booking?

Any state primary school can make a booking for a Year 5 or Year 6 class.

## Can a school bring more than one class to participate in a workshop?

Yes, we welcome multiple bookings from schools but we can only book in one class of 30 children per day.


## How do you get to Two Temple Place?

Our address is 2 Temple Place, London, WC2R 3BD. The nearest tube station is Temple, which is on the Circle & District lines. To plan your route we suggest using [www.tfl.gov.uk](http://www.tfl.gov.uk) - your school may have an account with TFL through which you can book your journey.

Children and accompanying adults travel for free on the tubes and buses on the school's ticket. However, please be aware that for school groups to travel for free on the tube, schools must apply for the tickets at least 14 days in advance. In addition, tube journeys beginning in zone 1 or 2 cannot begin before 9:50, while tube journeys beginning in zones 3-9 can begin at 9:30. Bus and tram journeys can also begin at 9:30. Please note we recommend that school groups arrive as close to 10am as possible.

## Are there any maps available?

## What are the gallery's opening hours?

During the week we are open Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday 10.00 – 16.30. We are closed on Tuesdays.

## How much will a visit cost?

Visits to Two Temple Place are **FREE**. This includes admission to the exhibition, a **FREE** workshop with the *WholeStory* and use of the lunch room. Thanks to the generous support from the Bulldog Trust and the Guild of St. George, we are able to offer these workshops to primary schools for free to state schools.

## What will the FREE workshop consist of?

This year the *WholeStory* will invite Year 5 and 6 children to delve into the mind of John Ruskin, who believed that both art and nature are essential to humans as individuals and as a society. A radical thinker for the Victorian era (Ruskin advocated for education for girls and less industrialisation - he even warned of the damage being done to the environment!), he is celebrated today as a historic figure who made waves by speaking up for what he thought was important. What will your class do to improve their world and their future? What will they take a stand for?

We're inviting schoolchildren across London to explore and discover through an immersive storytelling workshop how Ruskin promoted his ideas and how children today can be engaged with making a positive impact on their city.

During this workshop your school group will spend time in both the exhibition and in a dedicated space for creative activities, drawing from observation and contributing to an enormous collaborative art display. They will voice their commitments to improving their surroundings – perhaps picking up litter or spending more time outdoors - and make demands from those in power; whether it's clean air to breathe, a place to hear and make music, creating a sanctuary for badgers in Hyde Park or mosaics on the school wall, children are encouraged to speak up!

This project will conclude with close to 1000 schoolchildrens' commitments and demands being presented to the Mayor of London's office. We will impress on Sadiq Khan that Ruskin's belief that art and nature are essential to wellbeing are just as valid today as 200 years ago, and that we are all responsible for their enactment.

The workshop will begin shortly after you arrive (as close to 10:00 as possible) and should finish at the latest 14.30 with a lunch break in between.

### Is there somewhere for the children to have lunch and leave their coats?

Yes. We have converted the underground vault into a lunchroom for the children. There is space for them to sit and eat, and for them to leave any coats and bags.

### Can we come and do a self-led visit without a workshop?

Of course you can! We welcome all school groups to the gallery. Please do let us know of your plans in advance so that we can help you make the most of your visit. Please note all facilities including the lunchroom may not be available for your use if there is a school group booked in a workshop at the same time.

### Is there any outdoor space for them to run around in?

Yes. Two Temple Place is just next to Temple Gardens where children would be able to get some fresh air (see map above).
